Six years ago, Trina found herself six months removed from jail. She was in a relationship with her current husband Mike and had two small children, Alexis and Angelica. Times were pretty rough back then because they were both in the midst of drug and alcohol rehab. Through a childhood friend, Terri Crain, Mike and Trina were introduced to Allen Creek and at the same time Trina was re-united with her three older daughters, Kamran, Nichole, and Kasey. According to Trina, “Finding AC3 has helped me become a better mom, wife, and friend. Without AC3 I feel that I would be lost.”

The first thing that Trina did was plug herself into a small group for blended families and a women’s group. These groups were a real blessing to Trina because the groups introduced her to a whole new group of friends that showed her the true meaning of trust and support. These groups were also vital in teaching Trina about God’s Word, healing, and forgiveness. About these groups Trina says, “I wouldn’t be where I am today in my growth as a person and as a Christian without them.”

After a period of time, Trina volunteered for the Kreek Kids program as a helper and later as a teacher where she found her true passion for children’s ministry. After six years of stretching her wings Trina has been hired as the Saturday night children’s program director where she has been doing a marvelous job.

In fact she has been doing such a good job that the Saturday night program has grown from six children a night to an average of twenty-five a night. Next up was Wayne Clinton, who taught us about our *purpose* and how to recognize and use our individual spiritual tools. The last session was *Unity*, taught by James Brooke; illustrated by exercises that required us to work as a team to accomplish the goals.

That evening, we met for a “mysterious” assignment. We were to build an object, however none of us knew what it was we were building. We each cut and sanded our pieces according to the template provided. At the close of the evening we spent time around the campfire.

Sunday morning brought the final session, as Rick Thiessen taught us about our *commission*. What followed next was the highlight of the retreat.

"Worship is more than singing and playing in a band. Worship is the stream of living water flowing out of your heart. That means action. Praise is everything your body was made for:" The Bible says, "In Him we live and move and have our being. You are worthy, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honor and power, for you created all things and by your will they were created and have their being." Rev 4:11

Their worship is also serving, being and being made complete as Jesus uses them as a beacon in the community. What do they have in front of them? A guitar and lyrics- then sing. A pencil and paper -

then draw! A paintbrush and canvas - then paint! A camera and an eye for imaging - then shoot! A soul that longs to dance - then dance! A script and an audience - then act!

We have only begun to encourage the youth in their expression of worship. Please be in prayer for them to be unbound. Pray like you are adding oil to the fire; to keep it burning long and strong.

What you see above are images of a night where we just got the paint out and messed around. The paintings are not on a nice canvas, but on sheets of regular print paper, still, they are beautiful. Just like our kids, just like our God.
